A Day in the Life of a Social Worker

A social worker is someone who helps people prevent and cope with social, economic, emotional, and behavioral challenges in their daily lives. Social workers, like our beloved Retta Murphy, have an enormous impact on individuals and communities, providing social

services, education, advocacy, counseling, and so much more.

But what does a social worker do on a typical day? While a typical day for a social worker at Neighborhood Connections really doesn't exist, following NC Social Worker Retta Murphy around for a day illustrates the importance of flexibility and adaptation. Here's how it goes:



Retta arrives at the office at 9am, and as usual, a client is waiting for her. Today she helps this client fill out some tricky health insurance paperwork. Mid-morning, Retta loads her car with meals prepared by local restaurants participating in the

Everyone Eats program. She first stops at Smith Haven apartments, where she makes weekly deliveries to each resident – many of whom are older folks, some with disabilities. Not only does this delivery address food insecurity, it also allows Retta to check in with everyone one by one. If she finds a need, the resident is encouraged to make an appointment to come into the office. The Mountain Town Connector, our wheelchair-accessible van, can pick them up should they need a ride. While there, Retta distributes flyers inviting folks to Games & Goodies, a fun social event at Neighborhood Connections. (continued on next page)

A Day in the Life continued from front

Next, Retta heads over to a local emergency housing shelter where she drops off meals to people experiencing homelessness. As with Smith Haven, this gives her the chance to check in and make appointments with the residents. Being homeless is destabilizing and can feel demoralizing. Retta offers support and stability during a difficult time in their lives. Affordable housing is a challenge for many, and while Retta can't solve that problem single-handedly, she does her best. That might mean helping a client navigate housing applications, advocating for clients seeking housing, helping someone move into an assisted living facility, or helping to pay rent and moving costs.

Around 1pm, Retta returns to the office where she unexpectedly meets with an individual experiencing a mental health crisis. She immediately makes room in her schedule to help the client cope with the situation and makes plans to connect her to the resources she needs. At 4pm, she has a counseling session with a local elementary school student, helping him identify and respond to his social and emotional needs.

This was just one day in the life of a Neighborhood Connections social worker. Tomorrow will be a different day with new challenges and rewards. The one thing we know for sure is that no matter what the day brings, Retta always goes above and beyond to help.

Staying Connected

Our mission at Neighborhood Connections is to promote the health and well-being of the people in Southern Vermont's mountain towns through advocacy, education, and social services. We know that staying connected to others is essential for health and well-being. Living in our rural mountain towns can feel isolating, especially during the long Vermont winters. Throw in a global pandemic and you have the potential for no meaningful social contact at all.

Social isolation is a health concern known to increase the risk of physical and mental health problems. In rural locations such as ours, being isolated can make it more difficult to get to necessities like food and health care, not to mention recreational activities. Because we know how important it is to stay connected, we have staff, volunteers, and special programs in place to make it happen.

Mountain Town Connector – Transportation is essential to connection. Without the option of public transit, it is necessary to be resourceful. In November of 2021, Neighborhood Connections launched a long-awaited transportation program and

unveiled the Mountain Town Connector, our wheelchair-accessible van. The program has been growing since, with the number of riders increasing monthly and our group rides becoming more popular. On May 14th, a group of eight (photo above) went on an outing to Manchester for lunch at Charlie's and shopping at the Northshire Bookstore.

Friends & Neighbors – Some members of our community are essentially homebound, due to illness, injury, or a variety of other reasons. Some live alone or with a family member but don't get much chance to socialize with friends. That's where our volunteers come in! Friends & Neighbors matches volunteer "friends" with senior "neighbors" for weekly social visits at home. Friends can chat, share a coffee or tea, play games, go for a walk, and even bring their neighbors to enjoy fun group activities at Neighborhood Connections.

> Games & Goodies – Our regular Games & Goodies Gathering brings folks together to enjoy baked goods or other treats and to play games together or just chat. This is a monthly event that we hope to host

more frequently in the future. The Mountain Town Connector is available to transport anyone who would like a ride!

Exercise Classes – Bone Builders meets twice a week and on average, has over 170 monthly participants. Tai Chi for Fall Prevention meets every week and is also well attended.

Through the School Partnership Program, we connect our social workers with local school families to help them access resources and services schools are not staffed to deliver. Our partnership with Flood Brook School has linked families with case management and counseling services, offered transportation to local after-school programs at the Springfield Technical Center and, through a generous grant from Ben & Jerry's, delivered 30 Covid quarantine kits filled with personal care items and toys to help keep children engaged while they recover at home from Covid.

Provides a critical care ride to Dartmouth

Tom's cardiologist prescribed a cardiac rehab program to help improve his health while recovering from a heart attack. Tom worried about how he would get to Dartmouth twice a week. He caught a ride on the Mountain Town Connector with Buddy—our Transportation Coordinator. His heart is getting stronger by the day!
